STARRY

Behind the numbers of children and families served by STARRY are the faces of children, moms, dads, brothers or sisters whose lives are changed. They were saved from abuse or neglect, found someone who would listen to them, or simply had a safe place to sleep.

The STARRY ministry provides an **Emergency Shelter** for abused and neglected children; **Foster Care** (and adoption) for children needing long-term care; a **Counseling** program for children, teens, parents and families in a five-county Central Texas area; and **S.A.F.E.**, a program for runaway or homeless children and youth.

STARRY is at the forefront of the effort to break the generational cycle of child abuse and family crisis. It represents a continuum of care, because it isn't unusual for a child to come into the Emergency Shelter, either after being removed from their homes by the state or through the S.A.F.E. program, then move into Foster Care, and receive Counseling to help them mend.

In the communities it serves, where 2,500 children suffer from abuse or neglect every year, STARRY partners with churches local schools, state and local agencies, and other nonprofit organizations to prevent child abuse and promote positive parent-child communications.

Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me. (Matthew 18:4-5 NIV)

Talk to STARRY Foster Care parents and you will be amazed how often they tell you that it has been a life-changing, God-inspired experience.

"I did this to help them and it's amazing how God uses some of these children to help you," says foster and adoptive mom Angela Richardson. "This process has changed our lives," adds Amanda Andes, a foster and adoptive parent with her husband.

Angela adopted two sisters and a brother who came from a background of abuse and neglect, an experience that required her to carry the weight of three emotionally wounded children. "I was willing and I showed up," she says. "God did the rest."

Adoption is never an easy process, especially when the children have been removed from their homes because of life-threatening abuse or neglect, or when the birth parents give up their rights because of legal or emotional issues. But ultimately, Angela and Amanda agree, it's worth it.

"I wake up every day and say to myself, 'These are amazing kids,'" Angela says. "It's not about me, it's about the kids. My goal in life is to give them the absolute best future I can, making sure they know we are very blessed because God chose to make us a family. And that is a very special thing. God really put something on my heart."

Amanda and Jon adopted a little boy and a little girl who were welcomed into their lives with open arms. "Our home became their home and we were their parents," Amanda says. It was as simple as that.

STARRY foster parents aren't looking for rewards, but they find them in the smiles, hugs and kisses of their children.


