During the time when he was in foster care, his biological mom worked hard to get clean and back on track so that she could regain custody of her little boy. Through her weekly visits with Ryan and his foster parents, they were able to build a great relationship. Ryan's biological mom shared that him being taken away was the wake-up call she needed in order to overcome her addiction and learn to put her son first. It was clear to Ryan's foster mom how deeply his biological mom loved him. She knew that going back home was God's plan for Ryan.

It was a long, hard road and a lot of work but after nearly 12 months, Ryan's biological mom was awarded full custody of her son and was finally able to take him home. To see a family reunited was a true celebration! While Ryan's foster family grieved him leaving, they were so excited to see him back in the loving arms of his mom. Ryan's foster mom has since become a trusted family friend and confidant. She is now his mom's biggest advocate and parenting coach, who provides emotional support and encouragement when things get tough.

It is truly such a privilege for our staff to walk alongside hurting children and families and to be able to witness the restoration that can happen. As we look to the year ahead, we hold fast to the vision that every child across Texas will have a healthy, forever family. It's the passion that has driven our work this year and will drive it for years to come!

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


